Peer to peer training of multipliers: Nis, Serbia, 26th to the 31st of may 2008

The Association of the Local Democracy Agencies (ALDA) and the Local Democracy Agency Central and South Serbia (LDA CSS) organised a peer to peer training from the the 26th to the 31st of may 2008 in Nis. During 4 days, 14 young people from Nis (Serbia), Subotica (Serbia) and Prijedor (Bosnia and Herzegovina) have been trained in order to promote, employing a peer to peer methodology, the Youth programme at the local level, supporting the work of Youth National Agencies, Contact Points for Youth and SALTO resource centres. The trainers were the Marco Boaria of ALDA and the Sean Feenan of the International School for Peace from Italy and Northern Ireland and the project manager was Gregoire Fanniere from France.





On the last afternoon of the training the municipality of Nis offered the participants a bus tour of the main points of interest of the city.



Peer to peer training of multipliers: Kutaisi, Georgia 24th to the 28th of june 2008

In the scope of the « youth the right direction » project sponsored by the European Commission, ALDA and the LDA Georgia organised a peer to peer educators training from the the 24th to the 28th of june 2008 in Kutaisi (Georgia). During 4 days, 20 people from Kutaisi (Georgia), Belfast (Northern Ireland), Nis (Serbia), Monfalcone (Italy), Osijek and Verteneglio (Croatia) were trained using non formal education activities to both build a united team of participants and deeper their knowledge of projects methodology. The participants were enthusiastic and already started to cooperate for future projects or youth exchange.





Apart from the training the foreign participants had a demonstration of the Georgian culture of hospitality. The city of Kutaisi offered a tour visit of the main monuments of the city and a farewell dinner with traditional dances show and food. The Georgian participants also appreciated to meet people from all over Europe and strong relationships have been built among participants.



"The training in Kutaisi was for me, my first experience within the Youth field and the Youth work, and because of this I didnt know what to expect from it. After the course, I can say that I am really sutisfied, because it gave me the chance to make my first step into this new world of youngsters and all their activities proposed by the European Union. International Crossing Youth fair: Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro and Albania, 25^{th} of July to 3^{rd} of August 2008



25 young people from most former Yugoslavian countries and European Union crossing the Balkans from Croatia to Albania, passing through Bosnia and Herzegovina and Montenegro, sharing their daily life, viewpoints and ideas among them and with the locals, discovering the places and writing common projects in regular workshops. This is the result of the International Crossing youth Fair, an event organised by ALDA in the framework of its project

Youth: the right direction. This event aimed at promoting the European Commission's "Youth in Action" program and at deepening the mutual knowledge of the different youth contexts whilst promoting cooperation in the field of youth.

This event lasted for 10 days from 25th of July to 3rd of August it demonstrated that among their differences European youth can be united and that the physical and mental borders are not impassable. It opened new perspectives to these young people for future common projects and created strong friendships. Most of these young people are already involved in the work of the Local Democracy Agencies or ALDA's partners and it showed them the work of other LDAs and strengthened the network.

To share their experience the participants wrote diaries on a daily basis:

VERTENEGLIO, CROATIA:

24th July 2008: First group of participants arrived 24th in the evening in Pula and they stayed in Sabrina's house where they all had dinner together and met each other for the first time. The group talked about school system and the newly introduced Bologna system and problems youngsters have in collecting information about it in their town. Vesna from Prijedor gave very good examples of her commitment to spread information in high schools of her town. The dinner went on in a very cheerful atmosphere as all participants are very nice and heart lighted. After dinner participants were brought for a walk through the town centre where there were a lot of tourists around as in Summer in Istria in all the cities that are on the sea squares and streets are very lively with a lot of tourist. In the meanwhile other participants arrived in Novigrad as they were instructed, and they have been accommodated as well as trainers, bus tour drivers and participants from Niksic all arrived in Istria safely and in time.

25th July 2008: The bus tour came to Pula early in the morning to pick up the group in Pula. They then all reached Verteneglio and at 12h they met with other participants and trainers. The group had an hour meeting with LDA Verteneglio to set technical issues and some rules for the two-day stay in Verteneglio. Issues as punctuality, behaviour in hotel, rules to follow if they were to visit the area by themselves if they have friends/relatives, were checked together. Participants have been explained the whole programme of the two days by explaining them the way LDA Verteneglio has organised the first stop of the fair and then trainers explained how they have planned working sessions and workshops for the 26th July. At 13h there was lunch for all and after lunch scheduled meetings and seminars began following these schedule:

- Sabrina Quarantotto in the name of LDA Verteneglio explained the Youth: the Right Direction Project and the activities done so far. In this occasion there was the chance to introduce two participants Alen and Amir from LDA Zavidovici as they are the ones who created the logo and are the winners of the official logo of Youth: the right Direction. Then participants were asked to introduce themselves shortly so to give a short overview of their background to the local authorities present during the day. It was a chance for participants to introduce themselvees and to tell about their role within their local communities at home.

The Delegate of LDA Verteneglio, Umberto Ademollo, was then introduced together with the Head of International Affair Department of Istrian County, that is partner of LDA Verteneglio and also the newly appointed ALDA member of Governing Board, Oriano Otocan, and together with Andrea Debeljuh that is the Youth Ambassador of LDA Verteneglio and then also Tea Rakar the young representative on behalf of the Municipality of Verteneglio. There was the welcoming speech of the Delegate of LDA Verteneglio, Umberto Ademollo, who gave a very warm welcome to all the group and stressed the importance of having such an international group of young people as part of this ten-day fair. The Delegate underlined the great honour LDA Verteneglio has to host this first stop, to host so enthusiastic young people and was pleased to tell the importance that the event has arised among local media. All participants were therefore given the photocopy of the daily paper with the article about the event.

- Head of International Affair Department of Istrian County, Oriano Otocan, welcomed all as well and gave a very in-depth presentation on the activities Istria County has done so far and about all the activities that is still performing within several European projects. The presentation gave an insight on how active a County can be and how far it can go with its activities.
- Andrea Debeljuh, the Youth Ambassador, who is also the President of a very active local youth association Informo, explained all the issues about Youth Advisory Boards in Croatia and the state of art of national youth policy in Croatia. As he was involved also in writing the regional strategic action plan for youth, the questions that arised from participants were addressed to him and discussed together.
- Jessica Cassan, LDA Verteneglio staff in charge of European Voluntary Service and Equal Gender issues inside LDA Verteneglio, gave a presentation together with Ana Popovic from LDA Nis. Since they recently were in Georgia together within the Youth in the Right Direction, they had the chance to develop there a project proposal together with other project partners, so this was an excellent chance to give to all an overview of the project and to spread the idea in order to see who else of participants might be interested in joining the project. As the group will have ten days time to meet and exchange opinions about it, Jessica will collect suggestions as she is also travelling and so project proposal might be presented by the next Youth in Action deadline on 1st September 2008.

The first day session closed at 19h and all participants were brought to Novigrad for dinner. After dinner they had free time to visit the Music Nights Festival in centre of Novigrad, that is an event that attracts a lot of tourist every Summer in July in Novigrad.

26th July 2008:

Dear Diary,

Today we started about 9 AM, with a team building game in which Igor and Zeljko were volunteers. They left the room and Elvir explained the rules to the rest of the group. Everybody except these two, was standing in a circle holding tight each other, while volunteers were trying to enter the circle. There was only one way to do it, and that was to say "please", and although no one from the rest of us wasn't allowed to tell them, both of them figured out very quickly what was the magic word that can open even doors of steal, as the saying goes. After this game we were talking with our trainers about this game and peaceful way of fulfilling needs and goals. We were also motivated to speak about the situations in which we wanted to get or achieve something, and we weren't able to enter the group that we needed to cooperate with on this. So, we explained different approaches for the overcoming of this kind of problems, and made up a common conclusion that kindly asking for joining, after explaining one's needs, was the best of them. Afterwards, we prepared everything for the presentations of regions and towns that participants came from. The presenters were using multimedia approach, and all presentations were interactive and interesting. As people were given a chance to ask all they wanted, it was very useful, so we gained a lot of new information. Presenters from the towns that we are about to visit, were very consise and their presentations were shorter, we were given some materials, and fed with great Danish candies that our new friends kindly gave us. After the break, Elvir made a small presentation about dialogue and debate and the differences of these two ways of communication. After discussing about the positive and negative sides of both of them, we agreed that during the seminar we will use the dialogue which is a better way of communication, because that way we can exchange information and build up our knowledge with respect for another persons who are involved in conversation. In dialogue, there is no

arguing and convincing, and it is very mature way of communicating, that is very suitable for us as a group and potential partners on the future projects. Nicola proposed us to do a SWOT analyses of the Crossing fair, so we did it individually. Christina, as a volunteer, wrote all these things on a flip chart. We commented on strengths, weaknesses, potential opportunities and threats, as well as about the ways of overcoming bad things and minimizing the risks, and use and increase good things and benefits. At the end of this part of our work, we wrote our expectations from our selves and others during the Fair, and Elvir read all of them. Then we agreed on the common rules for the work and communication on our trip. Also, Nicola presented the "Mail boxes" that we will use during the whole Fair, even while travelling, to leave positive notes to each others. The envelops will be opened at the end of the Fair, so everyone of us will be able to read what new friends wrote to him/ her. Then, after the lunch break, we spent a beautiful afternoon at Umag where we were swimming, sunbathing and walking by the sea side. After the dinner, we went back to Novigrad, and had free time to visit Music festival again, or do something else, according to our choice.

Peer to peer training of multipliers: Shkodra, 11th to 14th of October 2008

The newly establish LDA Albania in Shkodra, northern Albania has been inaugurated on the 10th of October and immediately started its first activity on the 11th. It was the third peer training of multipliers in the framework of ALDA's "Youth the right direction" project.

During four days, 25 young people from South-East-Europe and European Union countries including ten Albanian from Shkodra had the opportunity to deepen their knowledge of the "Youth in action" program and to draft project together.

Apart from the training the young people discovered the city of Shkodra and created real links among each other.



"The Shkoder training means to me a lot of "firsts": My first time in Albania, a country that I only knew for being somewhere in South East Europe...Then my first training based on "active methodology", which after years of university lectures was quite a change!
